Sports clubs



The German Olympic Sports Confederation (DOSB) is the umbrella organisation for German sport. More than 27 million members and almost 90,000 sports clubs are members of the DOSB. Member organisations are regional sports federations, national (sport-governing) federations and sports associations.



Regional sports federations (e.g. LSB NRW)

The regional sports federation of North Rhine-Westphalia (LSB NRW) is the umbrella organisation of organised and community-spirited sport in North Rhine-Westphalia (NRW). It is based in Duisburg and its member organisations include 67 associations of single-sport clubs and 54 town and district sports federations. The LSB NRW is one of 16 regional sports federations in Germany to be a member of the German Olympic Sports Confederation (DOSB).





Associations of single-sport clubs

The various associations of single-sport clubs are your port of call when looking to practise a specific kind of sport. They support clubs when organising and holding competitions for example.

Town/district sports federations

The sports federations are the umbrella organisation of all sports clubs for any kind of sport in a town/district. They have the job of supporting and promoting the clubs.

Sports clubs

Sports clubs are formed of people wishing to engage in sport together. A club is a community organised on a voluntary basis. Sports clubs offer a variety of different sports. Sports are actively played in these and they are the port of call for those interested in playing sport. The aim is to make sport areas or sports and gymnastics halls available to interested persons.

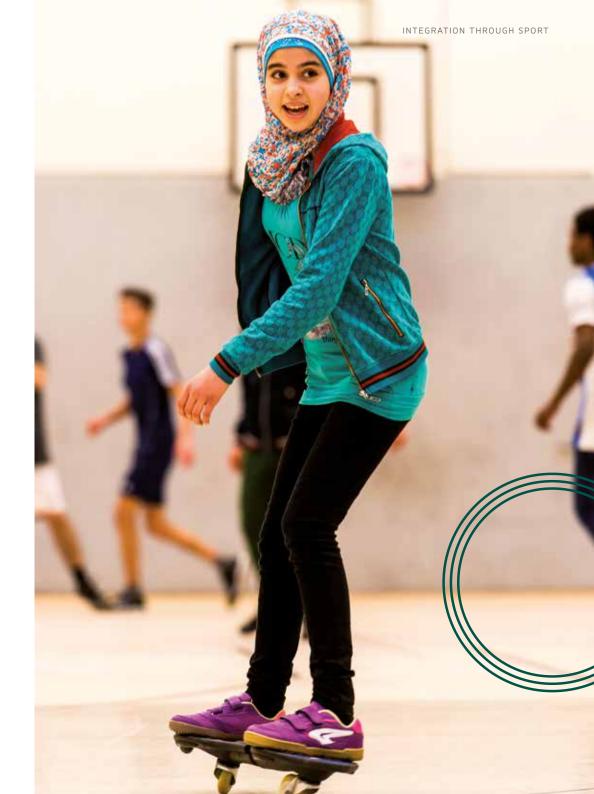
